The Paragraph:

A self-contained unit of a discourse in writing dealing with a particular point or idea. A paragraph consists of one or more sentences. Begins on a new line.

The Period:

Full stop, also called a period – a dot at the end of a sentence

The Comma:

The sign (,), a mark of punctuation used for indicating a division in a sentence...especially when such a division is accompanied by a slight pause or gives order to the sequential elements of the sentence.

The Ellipsis:

An unfinished thought, a trailing off into silence

The Question Mark:

The question mark character is used to replace a period at the end of an interrogative sentence. It's often used in place of missing or unknown data
